

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Supporting Arizona House Bill 2100 -- Missing; Unidentified Person; Reporting Requirements)

RESOLUTION NO. 21-060

1 **WHEREAS,** the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with
2 the authority to "promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals,
3 education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members"
4 and to "consult, negotiate and conclude agreements and contracts on behalf of
5 the Tohono O'odham Nation with Federal, State and local governments"
6 (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(f)); and

7 **WHEREAS,** in 2019, by Resolution No. 19-064, the Legislative Council supported Arizona
8 House Bill 2570 for the establishment of a study committee on missing and
9 murdered indigenous women and girls; and

10 **WHEREAS,** after approval and enactment of House Bill 2570 by the Arizona State Legislature
11 and Governor Doug Ducey, the Study Committee on Missing and Murdered
12 Indigenous Women and Girls ("Study Committee") conducted a comprehensive
13 study to determine how the State of Arizona could reduce and end violence
14 against indigenous women and girls, established methods for tracking and
15 collecting data, including data on missing and murdered indigenous women and
16 girls, and proposed measures in a report on the Study Committee's activities and
17 recommendations; and

18 **WHEREAS,** House Bill 2100 includes one of the Study Committee's recommendations to
19 require a law enforcement agency, which receives a report of a missing or
20 unidentified person, to submit a report of the missing and unidentified person to
21 the National Missing and Unidentified Person System that is administered by the
22 National Institute of Justice; and

23 **WHEREAS,** the Domestic Affairs, Health and Human Services, and Appropriations
24 Committees reviewed House Bill 2100 and recommend support.

25 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council supports
26 enactment of Arizona House Bill 2100 or similar legislation that requires a law
27 enforcement agency, which receives a report of a missing or unidentified person,
28 to submit a report of the missing and unidentified person to the National Missing
29 and Unidentified Person System that is administered by the National Institute of
30 Justice.

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RESOLUTION NO. 21-060

(Supporting Arizona House Bill 2098 -- Missing Children; Mandatory Reporting)

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The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 12TH day of FEBRUARY, 2021 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 3,175.7 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and -0- ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and 1(f) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).


