

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Granting a Right for a Utility Alignment to the Tohono O'odham Utility
Authority for Project No. TU 19-831)**

RESOLUTION NO. 24-021

1 **WHEREAS,** the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council is authorized "to manage, protect,
2 preserve and regulate the use of property...of the Tohono O'odham Nation" and
3 "to manage... or otherwise deal with lands, or interests in land" belonging to the
4 Nation (Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, Article VI, Section 1(i)(2) and
5 Section 2 (d)); and

6 **WHEREAS,** on May 15, 1991, the Nation adopted the Tohono O'odham Utility Authority's
7 ("TOUA," formerly known as the Papago Tribal Utility and originally established
8 pursuant to TOLC Resolution No. 08-70) "Second Restated Plan of the Operation
9 for the Tohono O'odham Utility Authority," as adopted by TOLC Resolution No. 91-
10 175, to plan, provide and furnish utility services to all areas within the Nation, to
11 acquire, construct, operate, maintain, promote and expand utility systems to
12 furnish electric, gas, water, sewer and telephone services within the Nation's
13 lands; and

14 **WHEREAS,** the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs, promulgated amended
15 regulations at 25 CFR Part 169 Rights-of-Way Over Indian Lands, which provide,
16 in part, that an independent legal entity that is wholly owned and operated by a
17 tribe that owns 100 percent of the trust or restricted interests in land does not
18 need to obtain a BIA right-of-way, but instead such tribe shall pass a resolution
19 authorizing access to the entity, without BIA approval, including a legal
20 description, and shall submit both documents to the BIA for its records (25 CFR
21 §169.004); and

22 **WHEREAS,** on January 18, 2017, the TOLC approved Utility Alignment Recordation
23 Procedures for TOUA, a wholly owned and operated tribal utility through
24 Resolution 17-032; and

25 **WHEREAS,** the Indian Health Service (IHS) completed a project proposal to address water
26 well arsenic levels for New Fields which exceed the EPA MCL; and

27 **WHEREAS,** IHS determined to address the high levels of arsenic by connecting the
28 community of New Fields into the Raboquivari Regional Water System (GSRRWS)
29 through the San Miguel system intertie; and

30 **WHEREAS,** this project was made possible through funds provided by the United States
31 Environmental Protection Agency; and

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1 **WHEREAS,** connecting the New Fields Community Water System to the Baboquivari Regional
2 **Water System will be of substantial benefit to the New Fields Community and**
3 **their respective members because it will address water well arsenic levels which**
4 **exceed the EPA Maximum Contaminant Level; and**

5 **WHEREAS,** the new utility alignment is described as a 50 foot wide alignment encompassing
6 **41.46 acres of land, more or less, which is more particularly described in**
7 **Attachment A - legal description, and as depicted in Attachment B - survey map;**
8 **and**

9 **WHEREAS,** the intertie includes the installation of 7 miles of 4" HDPE and appurtenances;
10 **and**

11 **WHEREAS,** the New Fields tank will be raised 10 feet, to improve pressure and provide
12 **capacity for peak community demands; and**

13 **WHEREAS,** a pumping station will be installed at San Miguel to fill the New Fields tank; and

14 **WHEREAS,** the Cbukut Kuk District Councils have approved through resolutions No. 2013-35
15 **Supporting Regionalization of the San Miguel/Miguel and New Fields Water**
16 **System with the Baboquivari Regional Water System; and**

17 **WHEREAS,** TOUA has submitted a complete application to the Nation's Realty Office for the
18 **approval and recordation of a new utility alignment as required under the**
19 **Nation's Utility Alignment Recordation Procedures; and**

20 **WHEREAS,** the Agricultural and Natural Resources Committee has reviewed and
21 **recommends to the Legislative Council the approval of the planned water**
22 **distribution alignment.**

23 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby grants**
24 **to TOUA a right to utility alignment for Project TU 19-831 based on the submittal**
25 **of an acceptable Application for Utility Alignment with all documentation**
26 **required by the Application and which includes an accurate legal description in**
27 **accordance with 25 CFR 169.102(b)(1), and a survey grade Map of Definite**
28 **Location, prepared in accordance with 25 CFR §169.102(b)(2) as these sections**
29 **may be amended from time to time, certified by a registered professional**
30 **engineer or an Arizona Registered Land Surveyor.**

31 **BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby grants approval**
32 **of any encroachment permits for this project, including future individual**
33 **services installed on the system, which may be granted by the Bureau of Indian**
34 **Affairs pursuant to federal regulations to allow the utility alignment or service**

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lines to individual customers to cross roads constructed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 17TH day of JANUARY 2024 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 3,263.3 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [04] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 2(d) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).


