(Authorizing the Nation to Join the Native American Finance Officers Association's Amicus Brief in Becerra v. San Carlos Apache Tribe and Becerra v. Northern Arapaho Tribe)

RESOLUTION NO. 24-040

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with
2		the authority to "consult, negotiate and conclude agreements and contracts on
3		behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation with Federal, State and local governments
4		and other Indian tribes" and to "promote, protect and provide for public health,
5		peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and
6		its members (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(f) and Section 1(c)(2)); and
7	WHEREAS,	the Native American Finance Officers Association ("NAFOA") drafted an amicus
8		brief in the two consolidated cases of Becerra v. San Carlos Apache Tribe and
9		Becerra v. Northern Arapaho Tribe before the United States Supreme Court (53
10		F.4th 1236, 61 F.4th 810); and
11	WHEREAS,	Becerra v. San Carlos Apache Tribe and Becerra v. Northern Arapaho Tribe
12		consider whether the Indian Health Service ("IHS") must reimburse tribes for
13		contract support costs for activities that are funded by third-party reimbursement
14		revenues tribes collect from sources such as Medicare, Medicaid, and other
15		insurance sources if the tribe operates health care services under an Indian-Self
16		Determination and Education Assistance Act ("Act") agreement; and
17	WHEREAS,	NAFOA's brief argues that Congress intended for the Act to allow tribal contractors
18		to be able to fund the same amount of medical services as would be provided by
19		programs operated by the federal government directly—including the medical
20		services funded by program income; and
21	WHEREAS,	in the best interests of the Nation, the Health and Human Services Committee
22		reviewed the matter and recommends authorizing the Nation to join NAFOA's
23		amicus brief in Becerra v. San Carlos Apache Tribe and Becerra v. Northern
24		Arapaho Tribe to ensure that tribes are afforded the same amount of funding as
25		programs operated by the federal government directly.
26	NOW, THE	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
27		authorizes the Nation to join NAFOA's amicus brief in Becerra v. San Carlos
28		Apache Tribe and Becerra v. Northern Arapaho Tribe.
