1	WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation ("Nation") is a federally recognized Indian tri			
2		organized pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18,		
3		1934 (48 Stat. 984; 25 U.S.C. § 476), which exercises sovereignty over both its		
4		members, its enterprises, and its lands; and		
5	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with		
6		the authority to "authorize, charter and regulate public or private corporations		
7		and associations whether organized for profit, or for non-profit or charitable		
8		purposes" and "to promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals,		
9	1	education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members"		
10		(Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(e) and Section 1(c)(2)); and		
11	WHEREAS,	the Second Restated Plan of Operation of the Tohono O'odham Utility Anthority		
12		("TOUA Plan of Operation"), 24 Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 1, was adopted		
13		by Resolution No. 91-175 (TOUA was formerly known as the "Papago Tribal		
14		Utility Authority" and was originally established pursuant to Resolution No. 08-		
15		70); and		
16	WHEREAS,	the stated purposes of the TOUA Management Board include, among other		
17		purposes, the purpose to "plan for, provide and furnish ntility services to all areas		
18		within the Tohono O'odham Nation, where such services are determined to be		
19		feasible and economic," "promote the use of utility services where available in		
20		order to improve the health and welfare of the residents of the Tohono O'odham		
21		Nation," and to "acquire, construct, operate, maintain, promote and expand utility		
22		systems within the Tohono O'odham Nation." (24 Tohono O'odham Code		
23		Chapter 1, Section 4.A.1, 2, and 3.); and		
24	WHEREAS,	Section 5 of TOUA's Plan grants TOUA "the franchise, right, permit, easement and		
25		privilege of placing, erecting, constructing, repairing, removing, replacing,		
26		maintaining, using and operating public utility systems, lines and facilities		
27		together with the right of ingress and egress on, over, under and across		
28		unallotted lands of the Tohono O'odham Nation" subject to the provisions of		
29		TOUA's Second Restated Plan of Operations as adopted into 24 Tohono O'odham		
30		Code, Chapter 1; and		
31	WHEREAS,	among other powers, the Plan provides that TOUA's Management Board shall		
32		"exercise full power and shall be responsible for the custody and management,		

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1		operation, inventory and maintenance of all utilities and facilities; the planning,
2	S	construction and operating of all new facilities; and for the taking of any and all
3		usual, necessary and convenient action incidental thereto," (24 Tohono O'odham
4		Code Chapter 1, Section 7.A.3); and
5	WHEREAS,	the National Telecommunications and Information Administration ("NTIA")
6		published Funding Opportunity Number: NTIA-ICG-TBCPO-2023-2008098, the
7		second round of the Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program, a federal funding
8		program that provides grants to eligible entities to "expand access to and adoption
9		of: (i) broadband service on Tribal Land; or (ii) programs that promote the use of
10		broadband to access remote learning, telework, or telehealth resources"; and
11	WHEREAS,	NTIA expects to make awards under this program within the following funding
12		ranges: 1) Broadband Infrastructure Deployment Projects and 2) Broadband
13		Adoption and Use Projects; and
14	WHEREAS,	TOUA qualifies as an "eligible entity" under Section 905(a)(8) of the Consolidated
15		Appropriations Act, 2021, Division N, Title IX, Section 905, Pub. L. No. 116-260,
16		134 Stat. 1182 (Dec. 27, 2020); and
17	WHEREAS,	TOUA intends to seek funding for Broadband Infrastructure Deployment Projects
18		and because TOUA is a subsidiary of the Tohono O'odham Nation a "Tribal
19		Government Resolution" or "Tribal Resolution of Consent" is necessary; and
20	WHEREAS,	upon receipt of an award by NTIA, a further resolution will be required to 1)
21		provide a limited waiver of sovereign immunity for the purpose of providing an
22		Enforceable Buildout Commitment for Underserved Areas, and 2) provide Tribal
23		Government Certification of Underserved Areas; and
24	WHEREAS,	TOUA has prepared and presented the grant proposal which, if awarded, will
25		provide funding for a broadband infrastructure deployment project that will
26		benefit those within the Nation's lands and requests the consent of the Tohono
27		O'odham Legislative Council to submit the grant proposal to the funding agency.
28	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council approves
29		this Resolution of Consent acknowledging that the Tohono O'odham Utility
30		Authority ("TOUA") will submit an application for Funding Opportunity Number:
31		NTIA-ICG-TBCPO-2023-2008098, the second round of the Tribal Broadband
32		Connectivity Program.
33	BE IT FINA	ALLY RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council approves the
34		rationale and source data provided by TOUA, in substantially the form attached,

NOT VOTING; and [O3] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1(e) and Section 1(c)(2) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
