

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL**  
**(Suspending Authority to Expend Sif Oidak District Budget Funds)**

**RESOLUTION NO. 24-091**

1   **WHEREAS,** the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with  
2   the fiscal powers to "prevent the use, disposition or encumbrance of fiscal assets  
3   of the Tohono O'odham Nation," "manage any funds within the exclusive control  
4   of the Tohono O'odham Nation . . . and to appropriate these funds for the benefit  
5   of the nation and its members" (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(d)(1) and (d)(2));  
6   and

7   **WHEREAS,** pursuant to Article IX, Section 7 of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham  
8   Nation, "[n]o district council shall expend district funds except pursuant to budgets  
9   authorized under resolutions of the district council and approved by the Tohono  
10   O'odham Council"; and

11   **WHEREAS,** the Gaming Ordinance, the Tohono O'odham Nation-State of Arizona Amended  
12   and Restated Gaming Compact, and the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act require the  
13   Nation to ensure that net gaming revenues, including revenues allocated to  
14   districts, are used exclusively to fund government operations or programs or for  
15   another of the specific purposes authorized by law (Gaming Ordinance, Section  
16   302; Compact, Section 16(d); 25 U.S.C. Section 2710(b)(2)(B)); and

17   **WHEREAS,** the Legislative Council is vested with substantial control over the Nation's 11 local  
18   district governments and over district finances; it may by ordinance change district  
19   boundaries, create a district, or disestablish a district (Constitution, Article IX,  
20   Section 2); and

21   **WHEREAS,** the districts "are organizations of fairly limited power and authority which may  
22   act only under the supervision of the Tohono O'odham Council" and which may  
23   not expend district funds without a budget authorized by district council resolution  
24   and approved by the Legislative Council (*Juan v. Juan*, 2 TOR3d 62 (Trial Ct.,  
25   Jan. 27, 2000) *appeal dismissed*, 3 TOR3d 1 (Jan. 4, 2005); Constitution, Article  
26   IX, Section 7); and

27   **WHEREAS,** the Tohono O'odham Judicial Court has recognized that even after distributing  
28   funds to a district, the Nation has an ongoing fiduciary obligation to ensure that  
29   district funds are expended under valid authority (*Angela Ortiz & Frances Ruiz*  
30   *v. Charlene Montana, et al; consolidated with Tohono O'odham Nation v. Gu-*  
31   *Vo Governing Council*, 3 TOR3d 34 (Ct.App., Aug. 24, 2011)); and

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**WHEREAS,** the Nation elects to allocate gaming, mining, leasing, and other revenues to fund district government budgets, and the allocations of Nation's funds are the primary sources of funding for Sif Oidak District operations; and

**WHEREAS,** the Legislative Council established the Sif Oidak Development Authority ("SODA") as an entity of the Sif Oidak District by Nation's Ordinance No. 01-86, "Charter of the Sif Oidak Development Authority" ("SODA Charter"); and

**WHEREAS,** in 2012, the Sif Oidak District Council approved District Resolution No. SODC 12-006 and requested that the Nation appropriate \$1.7 million, including \$1.2 million to purchase the 40-acre Bob's Market property and business north of the Main Reservation (collectively, the "Property"); \$150,000 to refund the Sif Oidak District for expenditures on a prior economic development feasibility study; and \$350,000 to fund SODA operations, overhead, and improvements for SODA to operate a business on the Property; and

**WHEREAS,** by Resolution No. 13-185, the Legislative Council conditionally appropriated \$1.7 million for the Sif Oidak District and SODA as follows:

**\$500,000 for the cost of purchasing 40 acres of property, the Bob's Market L.L.C. store, improvements, and value of the business as a going concern; \$150,000 to repay the Sif Oidak District for the Mile Post 21 project; \$75,000 for the SODA operating budget; \$675,000 for Bob's Market operations, improvements, and contingency; and \$300,000 for a fuel site at Bob's Market provided that the funds appropriated by this resolution . . . shall not be loaned to any person or entity, or be used for any purpose other than those expressly identified in this resolution.**

**(Emphasis added):** and

**WHEREAS,** by Resolution No. 13-185, the Legislative Council further amended the SODA Charter to increase transparency and accountability by requiring: (1) that the "books and records of the Authority, including current financial and operating statements and all budget information" be maintained at SODA's offices and be available to Sif Oidak District officials and others; (2) that SODA's books and records be "audited by an independent certified public accountant within 120 days of the close of each fiscal year" and (3) that, "[a] copy of the complete final audit and a comprehensive, written annual report shall be provided to the Board, District Council, Legislative Council, and Nation's chairperson; and the accountant who prepared the audit shall present it to the Board and at a District Council meeting that is open to District residents" (Resolution No. 13-185); and

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**WHEREAS,** the Sif Oidak District Council accepted the SODA Charter amendments by Resolution No. SODC 13-066; and

**WHEREAS, SODA repeatedly violated Ordinance No. 86-01, Charter of the Sif Oidak Development Authority, and Resolution No. 13-185 by failing to provide copies of SODA's complete final audits or comprehensive, written annual reports to the Legislative Council and Nation's chairperson for several years; and**

**WHEREAS,** despite Resolution No. 13-185's prohibition on expending Nation's funds "for any purpose other than those expressly identified," the SODA Board chairman, who is currently a Sif Oidak District Council representative, reported that the \$300,000 appropriated by Legislative Council Resolution No. 13-185 exclusively for a fuel site on the Property had been reallocated for operating expenses; no fuel site was ever constructed; and

**WHEREAS,** the SODA Board chairman, who is also a District Council representative, refused the request of a Nation's internal auditor to provide financial records for a fraud investigation internal audit as required by the Nation's Fraud Policy, 26 T.O.C. Chapter 1, Article 5, and the audit could not be completed in the absence of adequate records; and

**WHEREAS,** the Sif Oidak District Council has failed to manage SODA, ensure compliance with the SODA Charter, provide oversight of the Nation's \$1.7 million appropriation, or timely respond to numerous Nation's requests for financial information and records critical to conducting a fraud investigation and subsequent fraud accounting to evaluate, in part, if Nation's funds were lawfully expended consistent with Resolution No. 13-185, the SODA Charter, and the Nation's laws; and

**WHEREAS,** by Sif Oidak District Council Resolution SODC No. 23-170, the District Council agreed to the Nation's management and control of all District funds and accounts and authority to expend District funds; and

**WHEREAS,** by Resolution No. 23-440, the Legislative Council transferred to the Nation all financial management functions of the Sif Oidak District, control of all Sif Oidak District funds and accounts, and authority to expend the Sif Oidak District's funds in accordance with the FY 2024 Sif-Oidak District Gaming Revenue Budget, the FY 2021-2024 Sif-Oidak District American Rescue Plan Act Budget, and any other Legislative Council-approved Sif Oidak District budgets, as amended or modified;

\* and

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1      **WHEREAS,** the Sif Oidak District Council also amended its FY 2024 Gaming Revenue Budget  
2                  to repay the Nation the \$300,000.00 plus \$123,983.73 for the unlawful  
3                  expenditure of funds appropriated for the SODA fuel station, but failed to repay  
4                  the Nation; and

5      **WHEREAS,** in violation of Resolution No. 23-440, the Sif Oidak District failed to disclose the  
6                  existence of a Millennium Private Wealth checking account, failed to transfer to  
7                  the Nation control over the account, and the District chairperson and vice  
8                  chairperson retained debit cards and expended funds from the account without the  
9                  Nation's knowledge; and

10     **WHEREAS,** in violation of SODA Charter amendments made by Legislative Council Resolution  
11                  No. 23-440 and supported by Sif Oidak District Council Resolution SODC No. 23-  
12                  170, Sif Oidak District Council Representative Alex Vavages has refused to execute  
13                  documents required to remove him from the articles of incorporation for the  
14                  Arizona limited liability company he created for the SODA or remove himself as a  
15                  signatory on the LLC's bank accounts; and

16     **WHEREAS,** the Sif Oidak District's actions and refusal to act creates a substantial risk of loss  
17                  and ongoing violations of Nation's and other laws, and require further actions to  
18                  protect the assets and financial integrity of the Nation and the District; and

19     **WHEREAS,** in the best interests of the Nation and its members, the Budget and Finance  
20                  Committee recommends further action to protect the assets and financial integrity  
21                  of the Nation and the District.

22     **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council suspends  
23                  all authority to expend funds under the FY 2024 Sif Oidak District Gaming  
24                  Revenue Budget and the FY 2021-2024 Sif-Oidak District American Rescue Plan  
25                  Act Budget with the following exceptions:

26        (1)      the Sif Oidak District may authorize paid administrative leave and  
27                  continuing benefits for District employees; provided that the Nation shall  
28                  make such payments consistent with Legislative Council Resolution No. 23-  
29                  440; and

30        (2)      the Nation may continue approving expenditures for essential District  
31                  services and valid, outstanding obligations under approved District budgets  
32                  as authorized jointly by the Budget and Finance Committee and the  
33                  Nation's chairperson or a designee the chairperson identifies in writing.

34     **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council authorizes the  
35                  Nation's chairperson, the Nation's attorney general, and any Nation's Executive

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1           **Branch official or employee whom the Nation's chairperson designates in writing**  
2           **to take actions necessary to secure control of Sif Oidak District records and**  
3           **property.**

4           **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the suspension  
5           of expenditure authority approved by this Resolution shall terminate when the  
6           Budget and Finance Committee and Nation's chairperson jointly certify that the  
7           Sif Oidak District, and its officials, agents, employees have fully complied with  
8           Resolution No. 23-440 and with the November 2023 Amendments to the  
9           Ordinance No. 86-01, Charter of the Sif Oidak Development Authority; provided  
10           that the provision of Resolution No. 23-440 shall remain in effect pending further  
11           Legislative Council action.

12           **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that, notwithstanding  
13           any Nation's law or resolution to the contrary, until the Budget and Finance  
14           Committee and Nation's chairperson jointly certify that the Sif Oidak District, and  
15           its officials, agents, and employees have fully complied with Resolution No. 23-440  
16           and with the November 2023 Amendments to Ordinance No. 86-01, Charter of the  
17           Sif Oidak Development Authority, as amended, no further distributions or  
18           allocations of gaming revenue, mining royalties, or other funds shall be made for  
19           the Sif Oidak District

20           **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that nothing in this  
21           Resolution waives any civil or criminal liability of any person or entity, whether  
22           or not currently established or identified or waives any obligation to produce  
23           records and information; and nothing in the Resolution waives the Nation's  
24           sovereign immunity or Legislative Council's legislative immunity in any  
25           jurisdiction or forum.


26           **BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that, notwithstanding  
27           any Nation's law or resolution to the contrary, the provisions of this Resolution  
28           are not severable and if any word, clause, phrase, or other provision (collectively,  
29           "provision") of this Resolution or its application to any person or circumstance is  
30           held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction: (1) the Legislative Council's  
31           approval of the FY 2024 Sif Oidak District Gaming Revenue Budget shall be  
32           invalid, and (2) any authority to expend funds under the FY 2024 Sif-Oidak  
33           District Gaming Revenue Budget or FY 2021-2024 Sif-Oidak District American  
34           Rescue Plan Act Budget shall be terminated.

14 **Article VII, Section 2(c) and 2(d). Article IX, Section 7 of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham**  
15 **Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting**  
16 **Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section**  
17 **16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).**





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
